Dear Parishioners,

Life as a Christian can be very difficult. There are expectations placed upon us that people of other faiths, and those of no faith, don't ever have to worry about.

For example, consider the athlete. An athlete is an individual who is disciplined-someone of self-denial. Of course, I realize that these days, some athletes are not necessarily the best examples of discipline and self-denial, but there are certainly those who take their training quite seriously. An athlete must adhere to a strict regimen of training without permitting outside influences to interfere with that training. Naturally, there will be days when an athlete would rather forget about training and relax. But a true athlete will not do so. There will be indulgences and other pleasures that the athlete would rather focus on. But a true athlete will refuse them. The athlete who excels will not let anything interfere with the high standard he, or she, has set for his/her self.

We, too, as Christians, must also set high standards for ourselves. We must have even more discipline than the athlete. We must have more self-denial than the athlete. There are countless times throughout life when the easy way of doing things is the most attractive. There are many times in our lives when laziness gets the better of us and we relax our Christian values and standards. Because remember, the right thing to do is often the most difficult thing to do. And just as the athlete trains to make the body strong, Christians must train themselves also, to make their souls strong.

A quote from the Letter to Timothy states that the athlete who is crowned is one who competes according to the rules. Of course, as Christians, we have rules to follow as well. And there are many people in the world who dislike Christianity because there are rules to follow. These people accuse churches of trying to control their lives with these rules. We hear the term 'organized religion' being used by them. "I don't like organized religion", they say. "Organized religion is what's wrong with the world". They blame all kinds of unpleasantness on what they feel is an organized institution. However, they don't seem to mind an organized government with organized programs and organized public servants such as police and fire fighters, who are there to help them when they need it. They don't mind going to see the doctor, who is a part of an organized medical association. And they certainly don't mind complying with the rules of their organized workplace.

What is not understood by these people is that the rules that Christians adhere to have either been handed down from God or been divinely inspired. Yes, there are rules to follow, but they were not created to oppress us. They were given to us to teach us how God wants us to live. They were given to us so that we may be free from evil and temptation. It can be difficult to follow a Christian life. However, there is good news to be found in the Letter to Timothy which states that when an athlete has competed according to the rules, then he or she will be crowned. This means that, as Christians, we too shall be crowned when we have lived according to the rules. And while none of us can achieve perfection in this, what counts is that we do our best.

Response to Racist Violence in Charlottesville, VA

The Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the United States of America Response to Racist Violence in Charlottesville, VA

The Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the United States of America stands with all people of good will in condemning the hateful violence and lamenting the loss of life that resulted from the shameful efforts to promote racial bigotry and white supremacist ideology in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The Orthodox Church emphatically declares that it does not promote, protect or sanction participation in such reprehensible acts of hatred, racism, and discrimination, and proclaims that such beliefs and behaviors have no place in any community based in respect for the law and faith in a loving God.

The essence of the Christian Gospel and the spirit of the Orthodox Tradition are entirely and self-evidently incompatible with ideologies that declare the superiority of any race over another. Our God shows no partiality or favoritism (Deuteronomy 10:17, Romans 2:11). Our Lord Jesus Christ *broke down the dividing wall of hostility that had separated God from humans and humans from each other* (Ephesians 2:14). In Christ Jesus, the Church proclaims, there can be *neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male or female, but all are one* (Galatians 3:28). Furthermore, we call on one another *to have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather to expose them* (Ephesians 5:11). And what is darkness if not hatred? *The one who hates his brother is in the darkness and walks in the darkness* (1 John 2:11)!

Furthermore, in 1872, Hierarchs from around the world assembled in Constantinople and denounced all forms of xenophobia and chauvinism (*phyletism*). They agreed that the promotion of racial or national supremacy and ethnic bias or dissension in the Church of Christ is to be censured as contrary to the sacred teachings of the Christian Gospel and the holy canons of the Church. It is formally condemned as heresy, the strongest category of false teaching.

Finally, such actions as we have witnessed in recent days, by self-proclaimed white supremacists, neo-Nazis, and various racists and fascists, betray the core human values of love and solidarity. In this, we pray wholeheartedly for the families of those who lost their lives or suffered in these tragic events. In like manner, we cannot condone any form of revenge or retaliation by any group or individual. Therefore, we fervently appeal to every person of good will, and especially the leaders of our great nation, to consider and adopt ways of reconciling differences in order to rise above any and all discrimination in our history, our present, and our future.



gust 15th. Both feast days were celebrated with liturgies presided over by Fr. Sean.






tion for the entire event. Kitchen Chef also works with our restaurant operators on entrée donations. Chef led a team in making/freezing the stuffed peppers earlier this month. An arduous and critical job, Chef will be working steadily from Labor Day till end of day Sun-


