Dear Parishioners,

By the time you receive this note, we will be at the beginning of Great Lent- a major period of prayer and reflection for Orthodox Christians throughout the world. It is the period during which we note the subdued atmosphere in the tone of our services, the scriptural readings, and even in the vestments of the clergy. It is the period which ultimately turns from dark to bright when we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Along with the increased prayer during Lent comes the practice of fasting. This is a spiritual practice that has been utilized and revered by the Church, and even indeed other faiths as well, for thousands of years. The idea of fasting is an important one for our faith. However, over the years, there have been many misconceptions and understandings about it.

First, the fast is not the same as it is during a non-Lenten week, where we fast on Wednesdays and Fridays, and during very early (12:01AM) on Sundays until we receive Holy Communion later that morning (note, we DO NOT fast on Saturdays during the majority of the year). The fast for Lent lasts every day of the period, save for the feast days of the Annunciation and Palm Sunday, when eating fish is allowed. Many people think that we are forgoing certain foods as a punishment. This is absolutely not true. It is a spiritual practice designed not for suffering, but to cleanse ourselves of material desires and to help us understand that we are in control of ourselves. It is in place for us to devote more of ourselves to prayer and to strengthen our resolve as we follow Christ during these next weeks.

Second, fasting is something that is meant to be adhered to for those without health issues. If you need to take food, medications, etc. because of health reasons, <u>please do so</u>. No one would want, or expect someone, to harm themselves or to feel ill because of a misunderstanding. Holy Communion is a spiritual medicine and is not something that is reserved for only those who are healthy enough to follow the fast strictly.

Third, fasting is not solely about what we can or cannot eat. The Great Fast is meant to be a time of spiritual reflection. We should be reading Scripture, praying more, and doing good deeds for others. Sometimes, we get so worried about what goes into our mouths that we forget about what is coming out of them. Gossip, negative words, and judging others are all things that need to be thrown out. Lent is the perfect time to make this a life-long goal for oneself.

Also, as some people do like to use the period of Lent to receive the Sacrament of Confession, please note that I will be available for this by appointment. As a priest in the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese, we are not all given the blessing by the bishop to be able to hear confessions. Once a priest reaches a level of spiritual maturity, he may be given the blessing at the bishop's discretion. I am pleased to share with you that I was elevated to the priestly rank of Pnevmatikos (Confessor) a number of years ago. I know that most of you don't know me very well yet, and may not feel comfortable in doing so, but please do feel free to speak to me if you wish to schedule an appointment. And please know that Confession is NOT required for you to receive Holy Communion, as it is in some of the Slavic Churches. We are all the Body of Christ, and with a bit of effort, fasting according to your physical needs, becoming more prayerful, and casting negative thoughts away, we can be more spiritually prepared to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord.

And please note that you may always ask me if you have any questions regarding anything about our Faith. That's what I'm here for, and it is my privilege to help you.




