

Gospel and Epistle Readings

The Lord said this parable, "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."



Sparingly do I use Facebook. Mostly, I use it for the church and for updating the faithful. My personal cover page is the icon of the prodigal son. He is being embraced by his father. I put the cover up last year during this time as we began our journey toward Great Lent and sacred and Holy Pascha, Our Lord's passion and Resurrection.



I find it very fitting to leave this icon up all year round.

The spirit of this parable summarizes our life's journey toward our eternal father in seeking his kingdom. The immediate and warm embrace of the prayerful father in this parable is a promise from our Lord. This is the reception that awaits us. This journey we are embarking on toward Great Lent is meant to be a small preaseason of our whole life's journey toward eternity.

In this parable, we are shown the power of forgiveness. Once we truly look inward and approach our Father in repentance, we are restored and strengthened. We are all imperfect and we lose our way often. Life offers us many trials and tribulations. Just as the father in the parable does not remain angry, our heavenly Father holds no grudges once we turn to him.

Saturday of Souls- The Church, in her Divinely inspired wisdom, designated all Saturdays "Soul Saturdays" for all the reposed from the beginning of time utill today, who await the final judgment. We who are alive today have the opportunity and responsibility to pray for those who are asleep. On February 23 (Judgment Sunday) we make commemoration of the Second Coming of Christ. Since the reposed have neither been judged, nor have received their final judgment, the Church rightly commemorates the souls on the Saturday before, and trusting in the boundless mercy of God, she prays Him to have mercy on sinners. This also serves to remind us of our own temporal reality in this world and helps us repent and focus on our eternal soul. We too will one day need the prayers of the living.




