Προσφιλεῖς ἀδελφοί καὶ ἀδελφἑς ἐν Χριστῷ,

Σήμερα τιμοῦμε τὸ Σταυρὸ τοῦ Κυρίου, ὑψώνοντάς τον κατὰ τὴν ἑορτὴ τῆς Παγκοσμίου Ύψώσεως τοῦ Τιμίου καὶ Ζωοποιοῦ Σταυροῦ. Σήμερα τελοῦνται τὰ θαυμάσια τῆς ἀγἀπης τοῦ Θεοῦ, ὁ ὁποῖος ἔστειλε τὸ μονογενή Του Yiò καὶ καταδἑχτηκε ἐκουσίως τὴν ἀτιμωτικὴ Σταὐρωση, μετασχηματίζοντας ἔτσι ἕνα ἐργαλεῖο βασανιστηρίων καὶ θανἀτου, σὲ ἕνα σὑμβολο τῆς viκης ἐναντίον τοῦ θανἀτου.

Today we glory in Cross of the Lord, raising it on high in the Feast of Its Universal Exaltation.

Truly, this is a marvel; for the love of God, which moved His Only-Begotten Son to willingly ascend such a cruel instrument of torture and death, utterly transforms it into the sign of victory over death. Today the Cross is lifted high as a Ladder unto Heaven, by which we may ascend through the same love that allowed the nails to be driven into the hands and feet of the most-pure Body of our Savior. He was affixed to the Cross and hung there as the fruit of immortality, "like a cluster of grapes full of life" (Lauds of Matins).

Therefore, my beloved Christians, with such a view of the All-Holy Cross of the Lord, we are invited today to think as well of our beloved Theological School and Hellenic College. Today we are called to hold up this precious institution of our Holy Archdiocese in prayer, in honor, and in the spirit of helping. We all know how the School has struggled for years to achieve stability and security. And I tell you this: Holy Cross and Hellenic College will only be preserved for generations of clergy yet to come, as the "Holy Hill" upon which it rests becomes a more and more the Hill of Golgotha – a place of sacrifice and love. In this moment, when we remember the Cross of the Lord, Its absolute universality for all time and in every place, let us commit to Its power in accordance with His word: "And I, if I be exalted from the earth, I shall draw all people to myself" (John 12:32). Let us embrace that power and transform our Scholi with the same spirit of sacrifice, generosity, and love,

From the desk of Fr. Neofitos

Our church is packed!

We need to expand into the Hellenic center to accommodate the faithful for worship!

Obviously, there is a lot of shock value in this opening sentence. The truth remains, since we have been following the government and Archdiocesan guidelines of social distancing, we can fit about 35 to 40 faithful in our regular church pews. We have converted our Hellenic center into a space of worship for Sundays and holidays. We have a projector which broadcasts the live service and we have set our chairs apart 6 feet to facilitate safe social distancing for our overflow into the Hellenic center. The space is optimal for children and wheelchair access. This allows for 80 plus faithful to be in total attendance when necessary.

We are happy to report that our faithful have been following the mandated precautions such as social distancing, wearing face masks, following the usher's clear guidance and directions, taking temperatures, contact tracing, and peacefully attending and worshiping on Sundays and holidays.

With Presvytera Catherine on the mend from giving birth to our beautiful boy George Nektarios, Gladys Paravalos has stepped up to help us chant the various services. Two members of our Choir, Olga Delorey and Eliana Georgelos have been singing in the choir loft to lead us in the Divine Liturgy. These individuals are more than 15 feet apart and positioned on our choir loft as such for their aerosol particles not to travel beyond the choir loft. They always wear face masks.

These ladies and all our leadership teams and of course our faithful congregants have my fervent gratitude. Our St. George team has come together in a way that will inspire for years to come. We still have many challenges to face together but I remain optimistic because of the diligent response and efforts of all our people.

There is still no coffee hour after church. Coffee hour is too challenging to manage on a large "Sunday" scale. As a result, our ministry groups are being encouraged to start their meetings again and to shine a greater light on fellowship more than ever.

Coming together in the Lord's name and working His ministries can be safe with our continued collaborative efforts. Digital/ Virtual options are being offered for meetings for those who wish to join in from home and stay connected to the church. All of our youth programs such as Greek school and our youth meetings will be 100% virtual via the zoom platform.

Our Parish council meetings have also been virtual. Our Book Club was meeting via conference call a few months ago but now we will offer 3 options for our members: conference call, zoom video, and also in person in our Church.

For those that wish to consider joining any of our groups, you can email me directly or see our contact Leadership list in the back of this bulletin.

Philoptochos, Fellowship Group, Bible Study/ Book Club, Youth Group, and Greek School are our most vibrant ministries and we are happy to welcome new members. With our virtual options, individuals from California and Hours away from Schenectady, have been able to join and contribute beautifully to our ministries.

Our beautiful temple remains adorned with beautiful icons. The Holy Cross of Christ stands tall behind the Altar. The smell of incense still fills the air. Our most beautiful ornamentation in the church is you, the faithful pilgrims. WE are the church. Ekklissia in Greek, Church means the invited who come together. We are the church. Jesus our Lord is the head and we are the members of His body through the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Sacraments. By receiving His Body and Blood, we are healthy members of His body. We are the living "saints" of today.

"For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ. For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit."

All our struggles must be brought here and sacrificed at the altar where our Lord has taken on all the sins of the world. Will he leave our struggles, our pain, our suffering out? Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

St. Eustathius the Great Martyr, his wife and two children

The holy Martyr Eustathius before his baptism was an illustrious Roman general named Placidas in the days of the Emperor Trajan. While hunting in the country one day, he was converted to the Faith of Christ through the apparition of an uncommonly majestic stag, between whose antlers he saw the Cross of Christ, and through which the Lord spoke to him with a human voice. Upon returning home, he learned that his wife Tatiana had also had a vision in which she was instructed to become a Christian. They sought out the Bishop of the Christians and were baptized, Placidas receiving the name Eustathius, and Tatiana the name Theopiste; their two sons were baptized Agapius and Theopistus. The family was then subjected to such trials as Job endured. Their servants died, all their goods were stolen, and on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem they were scattered abroad, each not even knowing if the others were still alive. By the providence of God, they were united again after many years, and returned to Rome in glory. Nevertheless, when they refused to sacrifice to the idols-a public sacrifice from which no Roman general could be absent-the Emperor Hadrian, who had succeeded Trajan, had them put into a large bronze device in the shape of a bull, which was heated with fire until they died. When their holy bodies were removed, they were found to be without harm. They suffered martyrdom about the year 126.

O blest one, since thou didst emulate Christ's sufferings and drankest His cup with eagerness, thou didst become a partaker and joint-heir of His glory, O wise Eustathius; and since He is God of all things, He gave thee divine power from Heaven's heights.

In the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic the days seemed to stretch endlessly as our daily routines came to halt. Slowly we adjusted to a "new normal". Now, six months later, the days seemingly go by in the blink of an eye. The pandemic continues to impact our day-to-day lives in countless ways and we still face challenges and difficulties on many levels. It is uncertain when we will be allowed to meet as a group in the Hellenic Center. The Philoptochos social coffee hours following Liturgy have been suspended for the foreseeable future. Despite our inability to gather socially, we are grateful the doors of St. George are open so we can worship as a church family and receive the Holy Sacraments.

On August 21-22, 2020, the National Philoptochos held its "2020 Biennial Virtual Convention" via Zoom. The convention theme chosen by His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America was "...and the greatest of these is love". More than 500 delegates and observers participated representing chapters from California to New

York and Texas to Chicago. We were truly "together apart". The convention co-chairs did an incredible job in keeping the meeting on point and business was conducted efficiently. His Grace Bishop Apostolos of Medeia, Spiritual Advisor to Philoptochos, was with us throughout the entire convention and offered insightful remarks and guidance.

Guest speakers included Ekaterina Gladysheva Kehl, M.D. who spoke on "COVID-19: What to Expect This Fall"; Mr. Tony Hoffman, who spoke on "Opioid Addiction and Recovery"; Katina Nicolacakis, M.D. who spoke on the "Prevalence and Dangers of Vaping"; and Dr. Randa Kardsheh Anderson, Ph.D. who spoke on the "Impact of COVID-19 on Education and the Family".

I was pleased our St. George Chapter was included in the Power Point presentation on "Operation Classroom" – with photographs! Since September 2018, we assembled and donated 400 Student Toiletry Kits to students in need who attend Schenectady middle and high schools. The kits were distributed to in-school social workers by the City Mission of Schenectady.

Report of National Philoptochos Treasurer: "Once again, the faithful women of the Greek Orthodox Ladies Philoptochos Society excel in their unending mission to assist people in need throughout the world, perpetuate our Holy Orthodox faith and preserve the Orthodox family. We are honored to report that through the efforts of our chapters and individuals, a grand total of \$2,800,711 was distributed to our ministries, programs, and special appeals during the two-year period from

January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019. In addition to these distributions, in the first seven months of this current year we have disbursed another \$1,739,711. Total distribution from January 1, 2018 through July 31, 2020 was \$4,540,422". My dear Philoptochos sisters, this total does not include giving to local organizations supported by individual chapters. This is astounding! Philoptochos is living and giving proof that we are indeed the "friend of the poor".

As of this writing, we would normally be in midst of finalizing Festival preparations, but there is nothing normal about this year. Out of necessity for the health and safety of all, we had to cancel this year's event. However, it will take all of us working together to find ways to support our beloved St. George Church. We have all been impacted emotionally and financially by COVID-19, but in the words of Helen Keller: "Alone we can do so little, together we can do so much".
