"If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." Matthew 16:24

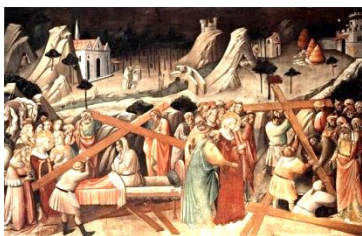


What better way to start the year then by venerating and celebrating the Holy Cross of Christ. By remembering our key mission as Christians, followers of Christ, to deny ourselves and embrace our struggles and follow him. To remember that only through struggle, our Cross, can we truly become human and live with our Lord. To struggle and persevere even in the face of adversity. Even through our own egos and arrogance.

The center of a Christian's life is the cross. The biggest difficulty has already been overcome by our savior. Suffering and death have been conquered. They have not been avoided or ignored. We are also asked to do the same thing. To face all of life's hardships by seeking the Lord.

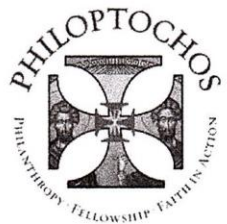

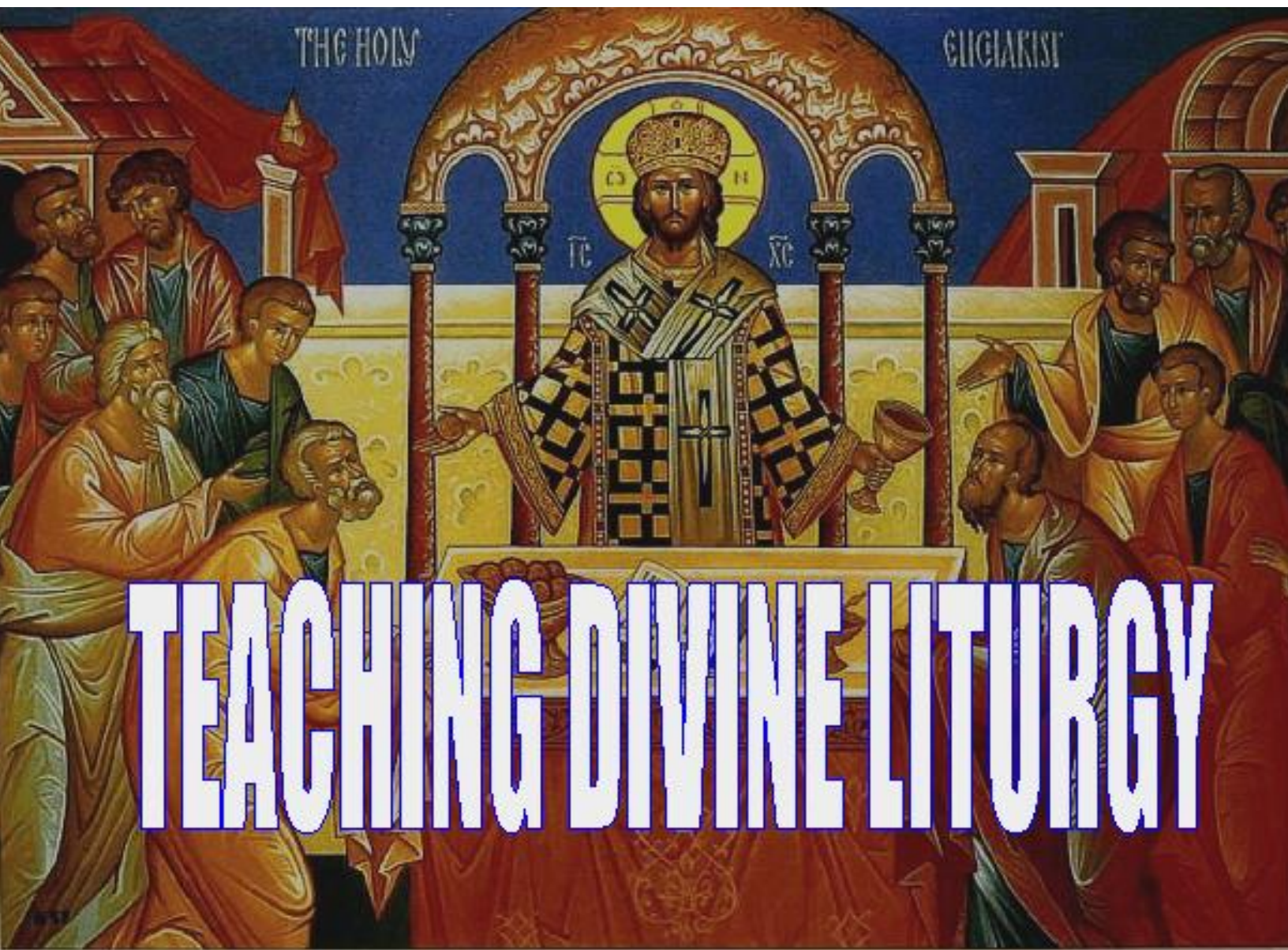

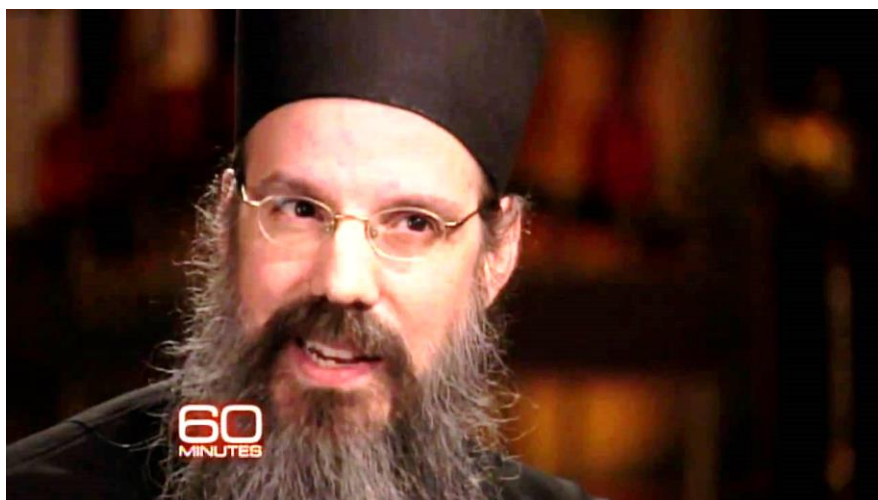
