

2022 The Divine Liturgy

We will be learning more about our main worship service.

- How Can we best follow The Commandment of Christ: "Do This in Remembrance of me."?

"Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day."

From the desk of Fr. Neofitos

"What shall I render to the Lord for all His gifts He has given to me? (English) τὶ ἀνταποδώσω τῷ Κυρὶω περὶ πἀντων, ὧν ἀνταπέδωκέ μοι; (Greek)

This psalm of David perfectly asks the question which we should all have in our hearts when trying to contemplate the gratitude we should offer our creator. Even if we offered Him 100% of our focus, our time, our treasure, our possessions, our resources, would we really be offering him anything compared to what he has offered us?

"For even if we offer You odes in number equal to the sands, O holy King, yet we do nothing worthy of what You have given us who cry to You: Alleluia." (Akathist Hymn)

But at the same time, in the Divine Liturgy, we pray on three different occasions for boldness to approach our master: "And grant us, Master, **with boldness** and without condemnation, to dare call You, the heavenly God, Father, and to say: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name..."

And also the continuation of the psalm above offers further instruction on Gratitude: "I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord, I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints. O Lord, I am thy servant; I am thy servant, the son of thy handmaid. Thou hast loosed my bonds. I will offer to thee the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the Lord. I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people, in the courts of the house of the Lord, in your midst, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord!" **Psalm 116:12-17**

So within the same Psalm and within the prayers of the Divine Liturgy we find the answer to the question: What can we possibly offer to the Lord for all He has given us?

He has granted us everything. Life and the means to thrive in it. Freedom and abundance of all kinds. Our families want for nothing. An ETERNAL soul. Our very existence was a gift of love. A creation out of His love.

What CAN we offer to Him in Gratitude?

Time: Our Sunday morning. A daily prayer in the morning and in the evening and before meals and tasks (call on the name of the Lord). Pray together with our family at home and at church.

Fasting: A sacrifice, a training of abstinence from foods like meat and dairy on Wednesdays and Fridays and Lents. Less quantity of food on those days. Focus on more spiritual endeavors.

Sacraments: Soul Food: Holy Communion (Eucharist, the cup of salvation from Psalm 116), Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Unction (anointing of the sick), Marriage, and Priesthood. Religious education: read the Bible and/or religious literature. This is how God feeds our spirit.

Service: To feed and clothe those in need. To visit the sick and imprisoned.

Community: To experience Christ through working with other Orthodox Christians as a church family.

Resources: Such as offering money to churches and charities. Volunteer talents to help those in need. Our Focus is a great resource which we use 100% of the time. However, how much of our **FOCUS** is on our God, on our Gratitude, on our own Spirit?

Witness/Martyria: To fulfill Christ's great commission and to Baptize all nations teaching all that the Lord commanded in the name of the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. To be **spiritual** means to work with the Holy Spirit and embrace Christ and His church. In today's world, it is commonly understood that "I'm spiritual" means I reject church and I am the center of the universe, not God.

Our FOCUS as individuals must stay fixed on our Christ the Lord. Peter walked on water and only started drowning when he lost faith, when he lost FOCUS, and when he focused on the negative and raging sea around him. Even then, we can cry out as he did "LORD SAVE ME!" The Lord only will save us. Ultimately, it is US WHO NEED THE LORD. **We are the ones who need all these beautiful offerings of love.** Our focus is like a flashlight. We can point it at anything we truly want to see. With our focus on Jesus Christ, we will always be walking a path of love and gratitude. A future filled with youth, promise, and legacy will be the future God will grant us here in Saint George if our focus is on Christ. FIRST as individuals and THEN as an organization.

In Gratitude and in our own flawed way oh Lord do we offer you this new Ecclesiastical year of 2022-23. We come before you on bended knee imploring Your rich and abundant mercy. We ask for the strength to boldly approach you in service as individuals and as a church of individuals. May your love for us enlighten our tired and beaten souls so we may be a vibrant presence and witness of your infinite Glory. Grant us the will to work hard so that through your Grace there may be a synergy of God and man through your only Son, the God-Man, in who we prayerfully worship and hope in, eternally. Amen
