A synopsis is a book which puts the the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke...also John) in columns, so that one can see more readily the agreements, disagreements, omissions, changes, etc. amongst them. Really good synopses try to integrate the Gospel of John as well. This is a really good synopsis.






### Why Vespers? (Saturdays at 5:30 pm)

- Celebrate the Resurrection of Christ
- Good Preparation for Liturgy
- Festive and solemn Byzantine Chant

Vespers is a beautiful service which we pray for the entire world. This service is short and contains the WHY of what is celebrated the next day. Saturday night is the beginning of Sunday because first, there was night, and then God created day. Saturday night vespers celebrates the Resurrection with hymns chanted sweetly to our Risen Lord. It is a foundational preparation for our main worship service, the Divine Liturgy.

### Why Orthodoxy 101? (Saturdays at 6:30 pm)

- Good preparation for worship practices
- Learn the tenets of our faith
- The Saints
- Important Councils and the Church
- Experience and learn from others on the same journey



Well, this might not be the first time you've seen a class like this but, it is necessary to offer information and training to the congregation about how to practice our faith. We have some converts to the faith and also a few catechumens that could benefit from a 101 course. All of us are students in the faith and if we are honest, in a low grade. This class will be geared toward the novice and neophyte but open to all.

### Why Confession?

#### (Any time by appointment and Saturdays before or after service & class)

- For Forgiveness of Sins
- For Life Everlasting
- Cleansing of soul and body
- Start a Spiritual relationship with a Spiritual Father

Confession is a vital sacrament of our church. It is biblically based and has a foundational utility of forgiveness and healing. The priest facilitates and ministers the sacrament in private. It begins and ends with a set of prayers. The penitent shares their sins with God through the priest during this time. Discussion may ensue if necessary. This is an opportunity to begin a spiritual child – spiritual father relationship with your priest. Advice and direction can be offered during this time for fasting, praying, reading, etc. It is also a private opportunity for questions about our lives.

Confession is avoided many times and not practiced enough. It is also a sign that if the devil wants you to avoid something, you should probably do that thing. The devil hates confession and the return on the sinner to God.

I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live. **Ezekiel 33:11** 

Confession is important but not as grave as some may think. Consider it a like a shower or changing clothes. You begin to smell if you don't do it often. This is why many confess their sins often so they may receive all the other sacraments of the church like Holy Communion and Holy Unction.





Why Choir?

Participating in divine worship services as a choir member is a sacred responsibility, not to be taken lightly. Choir members, as other church musicians, offer their God-given talents to the faith for a variety of reasons. For most, it is a part of their stewardship – the giving of their "time and talents". For others, it is something that is enjoyed and for still others, it is a social outlet. In Orthodox services, choir members represent the laity, responding to the liturgical dialogue set by the priest. This places a sacred responsibility on them during our worship services. They are called to be knowledgeable not only of the hymns and responses, but also about the correct order of the worship services. The choir is entrusted to be a participating part of the worship service, and its members must respond to the trust accordingly. Not all choir members are or need to be trained musicians, able to read music or have experience singing with a group. However, with love and practice, all can grow in their knowledge of the music and create a sound that matches the beauty of our services and their surroundings – the music, the chanting, the icons, the vestments all strive to be as perfect and beautiful as possible as we offer up worship to God.

St. John Chrysostom writes, "When we sing church hymns, we must be careful that we do not pronounce only the words with our tongues while our hearts wander elsewhere". This requires singers who are inwardly committed not just to the music but also, and primarily, to the Faith.
