

Resurrectional Apolytikion

You descended from on high, O compassionate One, and condescended to be buried for three days, so that from the passions You might set us free. Our life and resurrection, O Lord, glory be to You.

With the rivers of your tears you made the barren desert bloom; and with your sighs from deep within, you made your labors bear their fruits a hundredfold; and you became a star, illuminating the world by your miracles, O John, our devout father. Intercede with Christ our God, for the salvation of our souls.

Apolytikion of St. George

Liberator of captives, defender of the Poor, physician of the sick and champion of kings, O trophy-bearer, Great Martyr George, intercede with Christ God that our souls be saved.

Kontakion

O Champion General, I your City now inscribe to you Triumphant anthems as the tokens of my gratitude, Being rescued from the terrors, O Theotokos. Inasmuch as you have power unassailable, From all kinds of perils free me, so that unto you I may cry aloud: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride.

Brethren, when God made a promise to Abraham, since he had no one greater by whom to swear, he swore to himself, saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." And thus Abraham, having patiently endured, obtained the promise. Men indeed swear by a greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he interposed with an oath, so that through two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible that God should prove false, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to seize the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

Gosple Readings Mark 9:17-31

At that time, a man came to Jesus kneeling and saying: "Teacher, I brought my son to you, for he has a dumb spirit; and wherever it seizes him it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, and they were not able." And he answered them, "O faithless generation, how long am I to be with you? How long am I to bear with you? Bring him to me." And they brought the boy to him; and when the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. And Jesus asked his father, "How long has he had this?" And he said, "From childhood. And it has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you can do anything, have pity on us and help us." And Jesus said to him, "If you can! All things are possible to him who believes." Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!" And when Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You dumb and deaf spirit, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again." And after crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse; so that most of them said, "He is dead." But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose. And when he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting." They went on from there and passed through Galilee. And he would not have any one know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of man will be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him; and when he is killed, after three days he will rise."



Our very own Fr. Manny was born in Washington, DC, and grew up in Wheaton, MD. Attended the University of Maryland as a biological science major.

Left home to start Camp Saint Basil in the summer of 1975, as Assistant Director and lifeguard. Did a Bike-a-Thon from Garrison, NY to Washington DC to support Saint Basil Academy. Continued working at SBA until 1976, when he entered the Hellenic College and Holy Cross Seminary. Ordained deacon by God's grace through the hand of Bishop Gerasimos of Abydou in

November 1981. Graduated Seminary in 1982, and went to Greece for five months by invitation from Fr. Costas Sitaras to be a part of the Ionian Village program, pilgrimage to Mount Athos for a month, and then return to

America. Ordained by God's grace to the priesthood, through the hand of Archbishop lakovos, in November 1982. Assigned to Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church in Rochester NY for a year, and then Saint Basil Greek Orthodox Church in Troy NY since November 1983. Received a Doctorate of Ministry from Saint Vladimir Seminary, and the offikion of Οικονόμος, through the hand of Archbishop Demetrius in 2019. He helped start the Orthodox Christian Prison Ministry back in 1989, and has recently retired after 32 years with the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision, by God's grace and mercy, as Chaplain, in obedience to His Eminence Metropolitan Isaiah of Denver. His greatest love is being father to ANG Captain Sophia Maria and ANG Master Sergeant Anastasios George, and pappouli to Stylianna Maria.
